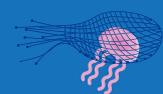

Unsustainable fish: not on my plate!



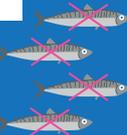
Visit the website of the organisation **Fish4Tomorrow** at <http://fish4tomorrow.com/>.
